Theme of the month: Kingdom of God

Greetings to all in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

The concept of the Kingdom of God is central to the teachings of Jesus Christ and frequently mentioned in the New Testament. It represents the reign of God over all creation. Kingdom of God is a divine and spiritual domain where God's will is fully realized, and God is acknowledged as the supreme ruler. This concept emphasizes God's authority and sovereignty over everything in existence.

What did Jesus mean by the term Kingdom of God? The simplest answer is that he used it to summarise his entire mission, in all its aspects. For Jesus the Gospel was the nearness of the Kingdom of God Mark 1:14-15. The word "kingdom" when used in relation to God is a parable of a relationship between God and his trustful children (cf. Lk. 18:17-"whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it").

It is a relationship which, though perfectly comparable to a father-son relationship, has also another complementary dimension comparable to a king-subject relationship. This metaphor of the king-subject relationship developed in a society which had experienced and valued monarchy for centuries and which from its experience under the rule of its kings had come to realise that God alone could rightly govern human beings and was indeed their sovereign Lord and the ultimate source of all authority and order.

The kingdom of God is near" (Mark 1:15; cf. Matthew 3:2; 4:17). Although Jesus never specifically defined the Kingdom, He illustrated it through parables (Matthew 13; Mark 4) and demonstrated its presence and power in His ministry. He instructed His disciples to proclaim the nearness of the Kingdom as He sent them out in missionary ministry (Matthew 10:7; Luke 9:2; 10:9,11).

The kingdom of God is both a present reality and a promise of future fulfilment. The Kingdom was present on earth in the person and acts of Jesus during the time of His Incarnation. After the Resurrection, the Risen Christ is present by His Spirit, and where His Spirit is, the Kingdom is present. Adolf von Harnack, 9th century scholar, defined God's kingdom as the secret rule of God in man's heart, based on Jesus' parables in the synoptic gospels that teach that God's kingdom is hidden treasure. He states: The kingdom of God comes by coming to the individual, by entering into his soul and laying hold of it. True, the kingdom of God is the rule of God; but it is the rule of the holy God in the hearts of individuals; it is God Himself in His power.

One aspect of Christian tradition has identified the kingdom of God with the visible institution of the church on the earth. The institution, hierarchy, property of the church is the very embodiment of God's reign. The Kingdom is the rule of God, and the realm of his blessings; the Church is the people of the Kingdom. who have received it, who witness it, and who will inherit. While the Kingdom is manifested in the Church, the Kingdom is not limited to the Church. The fullness of the kingdom awaits a final apocalyptic arrival at the end of this age (Matthew 24:27,30,31; Luke 21:27–31).

The kingdom of God is about repentance and the forgiveness of sins, the restoration of one's broken spiritual and physical life, humility, suffering, selfless service, self-denial, and eternal life, all of which one can only obtain through faith in Christ alone. The kingdom of God is something that actively happens right now rather than something that passively exists only in the far distant future. God's kingdom is both present in the lives of believers on earth today, and at the same time future in the manifestation of the full reign of Christ with His saints in the new earth and heavens.

We must examine our lives. Dear youths, this is a platform for you to gather together and express your views and ideas and have biblical discussions for your spiritual nurturing. "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth," (Ecclesiastes: 12: 1)

Choir: "Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs." (Psalms: 100:2)

Choir is an inevitable part in the worship. We are a blessed church to have the book of Hymns and Lyrics that have around thousand songs in it. The choir has a significant and an elevated role in our worship for which they have a separated place and a dress code. All choir members are dedicated for this service by the oath before God, but there is a tendency to ignore the oath and

forget our God. Please serve the Lord with the blessing that we received from the Lord.

Women's fellowship: "Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her". (Luke: 10: 42)

In Jesus' time, women were widely accepted and in the first church they took many vital roles in the growth of churches. They lay the foundation of a family, church, society, and a nation. In order to serve in many roles, they must be enlightened by the word of God. Women's fellowship is the forum for our women to study and understand the word of God and share their feelings and nurture each other in Christian faith. Let us gather together without fail and continue to study the Holy Scripture.

Men's Fellowship: "The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul, The ordinances of the Lord are sure and altogether righteous, They are more precious than gold; than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the comb". (Psalms; 19: 7, 9,10)

Today the church needs more lay leadership to be part of the church ministry. It is not a waste of time to spend time for a fellowship and Bible study. Rather it is a blessing that will manifest in sound wisdom to support your personal life, family life, official life, social life, and spiritual life.

Achen and family would be relocating to 19 Teck Whye Lane, #08-41, Singapore -680019 on **25 Nov 2023.**


9. Carols service

THE KINGDOM OF GOD

Is the Kingdom of God a Utopia?

"...the kingdom of God is in your midst."

(Luke 17:21)

As we live in a world of unending wars, injustice, and strife, the above verse makes us wonder about this particular teaching of Jesus. What we feel and experience around us is in complete contrast to this verse. By default, we assume the Kingdom of God to be a distant beautiful paradise. To understand Jesus' words, it's crucial to grasp the concept of Utopia, the Kingdom of God, and make a comparison.

What is a Utopia?

The word Utopia was coined from Ancient Greek and translates to "no place". Utopia is an imagined place where humanity reaches its full potential, and where "everything" is perfect. Everyone is treated equally, which is achieved through social and political conformity. This would mean the loss of "freedom" or an individual's uniqueness. To enter the Kingdom of God, must we conform?

What is the Kingdom of God?

The Kingdom of God simply means "the reign or rule of God over all of life". The Gospels provide us with the eligibility criteria to be part of the Kingdom of God (e.g.: Matthew 4:17, Matthew 18:3, John 3:3-5) and drop a few hints about the timing of the Kingdom of God (e.g.: Mark1:15, Matthew 12:28). In Jesus' parables about the Kingdom of God, there is one common trait: a transformation.

When we undergo a transformation in Christ, the world around us is susceptible to it. God's Kingdom isn't about rules and judgment but about Grace and second chances.

Kingdom of God vs Utopia

While both concepts ensure a world of no evil, the Kingdom of God is living while a utopia can never be real. The Kingdom of God spreads true joy, peace, and righteousness while a utopia offers a false sense of peace and justice. Most importantly, the Kingdom of God is eternal.

Conclusion




